Schedule Change Policy at JHS

Students are encouraged to register for subjects they want and need before the master schedule is finalized at the end of the school year. The course description guide should help you determine what to expect in advance as well as information pertaining to course offerings that align with post-secondary goals.

Schedule changes will be made for the following reasons:

- 1. Successful completion of a summer school course
- 2 .Not meeting a pre-requisite course requirement
- 3. Courses needed to meet graduation requirements
- 4. A missing requirement for university admissions or post-secondary plan
- 5. Incomplete schedule
- 6. Students may drop an elective class for a study hall

Once second semester has begun, students may request one schedule change for second semester under the following parameters:

- Students may replace a yearlong course with a semester long class with administrative approval if the first semester was not completed successfully because the course material was beyond the scope of the student's ability level.
- Students currently enrolled in a study hall second semester may enroll in a second semester class.
- Students enrolled in a course where multiple levels of the course exist may request a level change within the first six days of the semester. Level changes will be a team decision with the teacher, counselor, student, and parent. This decision will be based upon past class performance and post-secondary goals.

Drivers Education

- Must pass 8 classes the two previous semesters prior to taking Drivers Ed.
- Fee: \$250 must be paid at registration
- Cannot miss more than 5 class periods during regular semester, and 2 class periods during the summer session (State Law).
- Must be 15 by:
 - July 31st, 2019 for classroom during Summer 2019
 - November 30th, 2019 for 1st Semester
 - March 31th, 2020 for 2nd Semester
 - July 31st, 2020 for classroom during Summer 2020
- 2 Phases of Drivers Ed:
 - Classroom (.25 credits)
 - Behind the Wheel (.25 credits)
- Must have drivers permit for at least 9 months before obtaining a drivers license
- If taking Drivers Ed during the regular school year, the classroom portion is the first 9 weeks of the semester, the second 9 weeks is a study hall.

Physical Education

- 4 year requirement
 - 2 years in class required freshman & sophomore year
 - Must Dress & Participate to receive credit
 - If you don't dress, you will not pass.
- Fitness PE
 - Limited space
 - Focuses on strength and conditioning
 - Failure to participate results in regular PE placement
 - Must pre-register in order to be considered

Summer School

- Courses Offered 2 sessions available
 - Drivers Education classroom only (.25 credits)
- Sign-up in Late Spring and pay course fees in the JHS Main Office
 - More information will be available later this Spring.
