ACT Test Dates

With school starting again, we start thinking about post high school plans. One way we can get prepared for those plans is taking the ACT and SAT. You can register online at act.org. The cost for the test is \$42 for no writing or \$62 with writing.

Registration usually ends around a month before the test date, however you can register late for thirty dollars more. Remember to study weeks prior to taking the test and get a good nights sleep and a healthy breakfast right before. Good luck!

Out of the Darkness Walk for Suicide Awareness

The Morgan Scott Suicide Prevention Coalition hosted the 4th annual "Out of the Darkness" suicide prevention awareness walk on Thursday, September 6, 2018. The family members of Jeffrey Thomas lit the memorial candle in memory of Jeffrey. Dianna Castleberry, **Bursting Bubbles Mental** Health Peer Support Organization, was the keynote speaker. She urged all people that are struggling with suicidal thoughts to reach out and talk with someone. "You are not alone," said Dianna. "Please break the silence and let someone know what you are thinking and feeling". Dianna told supporters to "just listen". We all need someone to listen to us and not judge us.

Jacksonville Police Department Chaplain, Alan Bradish opened the ceremonies with a warm welcome to community members, area college students, students and their families, and community agencies. Pastor Robin Lyons, Winchester United

Methodist Church lead the opening prayer and Pastor Jared Reno lead the concluding prayer before the candlelight walk. Music was provided by Worship minister, Perry Case of the First Christian Church of Jacksonville. Refreshments were provided by the Jacksonville High School Foods classes, County Market, and Wal-Mart.

A number of families created loving chalk artwork in memory of a lost loved one to suicide in addition to lighting a luminary candle in his or her memory. Friends of lost friends also participated by doing the same and walking around the downtown square in the candlelight walk to bring hope and awareness to others.
